BOARD MEETING, November 16, 2010 **NEWSLETTER MINUTES**

Marilyn Porter, president, called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m. Other board members present were Sheryl Frank, vice president; Ray Gamble, secretary-treasurer; Bill Bailey and Ed Korte. Also attending were Alexis Martin, site manager; Beth Webb, assistant site manager; Mike Leach, maintenance superintendent; and Dudley Leonard, cooperative attorney. Present from Linville Management Services, Inc., were Melva Linville, property manager; Carmen Detherage, comptroller; and Suzanne Miles, human relations coordinator.

The board voted to meet in December on the 21st. Minutes of the October 19 meeting were approved unanimously.

Open Session

The board reconvened downstairs for the open session of the board meeting. Billy Still of Still Construction joined the meeting. Marilyn called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. Approximately five members were in attendance.

Mike gave the maintenance report. From October 19 to November 16, 134 work orders were called in and 119 completed. Since the October meeting, there have been two move-ins and one move-out. Replaced during this time was one refrigerator.

NEWSLETTER MINUTES CONTINUED

Construction on the interiors is 90 percent complete. Targeted completion is the second week in December. Construction on exterior shingles and guttering is done, leaving only the office work. Concrete work and mud jacking will be completed next week. Furnace maintenance and new shutters have been completed. Asphalt work, parking lots, will begin next week. As part of the renovations, the new drainage system currently being installed is needing 70 more feet of pipe and will cost \$1,000.

Alexis gave the office updates. Nineteen units are for sale; eight of these are vacant. There have been five intents to vacate. There have been 15 statements of charges due, three attorney referrals, 23 defaults and one animal violation.

Three boys were recognized for writing winning essays and their essays were read aloud. They were all given \$10 McDonald's gift cards. Mary Lou Hemmy was announced as the Good Neighbor of the Month for October.

Plans for the playground were discussed. Still said old equipment will be removed and new equipment installed. Asphalt and sand will be removed and the basketball court will be overlaid.

The board read and reviewed a member's proposal to waive carrying charges for members based on their length of ownership of their units. The board discussed the financial impact of the proposal on the budget and on the carrying charges. To fund this proposal would require an increase in carrying charges for all members. The board agreed that the proposal was not feasible or fiscally responsible. The floor was open to member comments. The session ended at 7 p.m.

Closed Session

Billy Still asked the board to consider improvements to the clubhouse. The board reviewed a financial agreement plan for members who want to make installment payments on work orders. The board voted to accept the agreement plan with a maximum allowable amount of \$200. The plan cannot be used for improvements. The board agreed to table discussion of purchase and occupancy agreements until the December meeting. Melva said National Cooperative Bank will be doing a drive-through inspection of the property on Wednesday. The meeting was adjourned at 9 p.m.




From Joshua:


From Aidan:


"I like living in Independence Square because it's a safe place with lots of other kids for me to play with and fun parks."
