Whenever you see suspicious activities or persons on Independence Square property, please call the Independence Police Department at 911.

Responding to and investigating all citizen concerns are what the police do. You can help prevent crime by being alert to strangers on the property and questionable behavior. To keep the cooperative safe for all of us, report your concerns to the police.

You also can call Central Jackson County Patrol during the evening hours when they patrol the cooperative. The patrol's phone number is 816-645-3001.

Security patrol officers respond to all calls and file reports. The nightly reports are turned in to the Independence Square office the next day.

Having this kind of documentation keeps management and the board aware of incidents and helps determine whether additional action is necessary.

Board Meeting June 19, 2012

Minutes of the May 15 board meeting were approved.

Open Session

Four members signed in for the open session at 6 p.m. They were Bea Parks, Jessie Phillips, Lorie Marler and Jean Hudgens. Marilyn welcomed them and called the meeting to order.

Mike presented the maintenance report. From May 15 to June 19, 106 work orders were called in and 96 completed. Replaced were three water heaters, a kitchen faucet and a refrigerator.

There have been four move-outs and one move-in.

Yard inspections are continuing. The fence that was vandalized has been repaired. On June 25, maintenance will be cleaning the outside of the air conditioning units throughout the property.

Alexis gave the office updates. There have been 31 statements of charges due, two attorney referrals, 22 defaults, one animal violation and three vehicle violations.

Nineteen units are for sale. Four of these are not paying carrying charges. Four applications are pending and one has been approved.

Marilyn announced the recipient of a \$200 referral bonus: Cesar Dominguez.

Marilyn opened the floor to member comments.

Bea Parks won the door prize drawing of a \$25 gift card.

Marilyn thanked members for attending and the open session ended at 6:20 p.m.

Closed Session

Dudley discussed the attorney status report.

The wording on the Vacating Member's Responsibility document was discussed. A sentence needs to be added stating, "Your carrying charges must be paid every month."

The procedure for pet violators was discussed. They are given a first notice, a second notice and then their account is sent to the attorney. The office will notify Dudley of the need for a final notice and will provide member contact information and the violation.

A notice will be published in the newsletter reminding members to register pets and maintain a photo and current vaccination records on file in the office.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
