Tips from the Toolshed

Oversized trash

Oversized trash should not be left by dumpsters or at the maintenance shop. If you need to dispose of oversized items, contact the office.

If you can make the oversized item fit into the dumpster, the trash company will haul it away. This may mean breaking it up into several pieces.

Recycling bin

The green recycling bin is for recycling only. The front of the bin lists what is allowed.

Please break down boxes before recycling them.

Plumbing blockages

Please do not put rice and grease down the sinks. Do not flush wipes or diapers down the toilets.

Snow removal

Please remember to remove door mats, pots and lawn ornaments from your steps before snow days.

Here's what cannot be deposited in the recycling bin:

- No batteries
- No bubble wrap
- No chemicals
- No diapers
- No plastic foam containers, cups and packing peanuts
- No food-soiled paper or plastic containers
- No hardbound books
- No household hazardous waste
- No kitchen oils
- No paint
- No plastic bags
- No plastic utensils
- No tires
- No yard waste
