throughout the property.

Those who fail to clean up after their pets are sent a notice and given 24 hours to clean up.

If pet owners don't comply, maintenance then is dispatched to clean up and members are charged a fee.

Please use water wisely

Water is provided for normal use.

Summer water usage is limited to filling a wading pool not more than 12 inches deep and to watering grass, shrubs and flowers.

Wading pools can be set up only in a fenced back yard and cannot be left out long enough to kill the grass.

Running a sprinkler for children to play in is not allowed.

If a member allows water to run into the street, the member will be charged for excessive usage.

Washing motor vehicles on cooperative property is prohibited.

Pool rules

A wading pool full of water is a potential drowning danger to a child and can become a breeding ground for mosquitoes.

Independence Square does not allow any kind of water slides.

Other reminders:

Please remember that children are to be supervised when outside and not playing in the streets.

Play areas located on the grounds are for children to play safely.

If your children are walking the dog, they need to be advised to clean up after the pet, too.

Pets should not be running loose. They should be on a leash while outside at all times.

Rock throwing on the property is prohibited. Rocks belong on the ground and are to be left there.

Picking rocks up, moving or throwing them anywhere on the property is not allowed.

Bicyclists, please remember than sidewalks and streets belong to everyone.

Rules for planting flowers

Flower beds in front and back yards should be planted next to the building. They cannot extend beyond the stoop approximately 56 inches.

The beds should be sloped away from the building to allow for drainage.

Any type of edging must allow for drainage and may not be more than six inches high.

Yard ornaments are confined to a flower bed. Raised flower beds are not allowed.

These early-detection devices are designed to be placed under mattresses and other bed bug spots. The bugs are trapped in adhesive and easily detected through a clear window.

Grounds Rules Keep Property Looking Good

Independence Square rules and regulations are designed to improve the appearance of the property and the safety and quality of life of all of us who live here.

Please help keep our community clutter-free and attractive. Here are some of the rules members have agreed to follow when they signed their Occupancy Agreements.

Members are responsible for maintaining their flower beds and fenced-in backyards.

Planting: Planting that could cause structural problems or mowing problems will not be approved.

Vines: Vines will not be allowed on the buildings.

Yard ornaments: Yard ornaments are to be confined to the flower bed.

Yard-keeping standards: Front and back vards must be kept clean and free of cigarette or tobacco litter, clutter, debris and trash.

Back yards are limited to lawn mowers, lawn furniture, large bicycles and barbecue grills. Toys are to be kept inside the unit when not in use.

Members with unfenced back yards must move outdoor items next to the unit to accommodate the lawn-mowing crew.

Outside faucets: Outside water faucets must be shared by members on either side of the faucet.

Lawn mower, grass trimmer available to members

Members who need help keeping flower beds and back yards neat can check out a lawn mower and a grass trimmer from the maintenance garage.

Simply call the office and the maintenance garage will be notified. These tools can be checked out for two hours.

Members are reminded that they are responsible for mowing fenced back yards.

Grass must be no higher than eight inches and the yard must be kept free of clutter.

If you receive notice from Maintenance to mow your yard, you will have 48 hours to do so. If not mowed during this time, Maintenance will mow and a fee will be charged.

If you leave for vacation, remember to make arrangements to have your yard mowed while you are gone.

If Maintenance has to mow, your account will be billed for the service.
