NEWSLETTER MINUTES

Sheryl called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

Minutes

The board approved minutes of the February board meeting and the executive session.

Property Insurance

Betsy reported that the cooperative's property insurance is increasing by \$52,315 annually. On July 1, the premium will increase to \$269,689 annually from \$217,374.

OPEN SESSION

Eight members signed in for the open session. Tom Quick, senior vice president with HUB International, joined the meeting to answer questions about the property insurance.

Sheryl welcomed all and called the session to order at 6:05 p.m.

Next board meeting

The next board meeting is April 18.

Maintenance summary

Tim presented the maintenance report. Concrete repairs have been completed.

Two basements had water leaks.

One roof will be repaired this spring.

Rock was refreshed at Building 11.

The drainage project between Buildings 18 and 19 has begun.

A new lawn company has started, U.S. Lawns.

Three rehabs are underway. Eighty-two service requests were called in; 83 have been completed; and 23 are open.

Site report

Tina presented the site manager's report.

No memberships are for sale. Since the last board meeting, there have been three move-ins, two move-ins scheduled and one eviction.

Celtic Hills Security is the new security patrol for the property.

Tailor Made Property Services

Betsy presented the managing agent's report.

For the month of February, one application was approved.

Processed in accounts payable for February was \$130,615.95.

Fran McGowan won the door prize drawing of \$25.

Sheryl opened the floor to member comments and the open session ended at 6:30 p.m.

Buyer-friendly sales bring bigger bucks to sellers

Successful yard sales make buyers feel welcome. Here are some tips to boost sales.

- 1. Get the word out.**
Advertise by word of mouth: tell friends and neighbors.
- 2. Get buyers out of their cars.**
Make merchandise visible from the street. Pennants, streamers, balloons and even clothes for sale fluttering in the breeze help catch a buyer's eye.
- 3. Get them to look at what you've got.**
Presentation is important. Displays need to appear neat, clean and organized. Group related items together, such as high chairs, cribs and other large baby furniture. But remember, you want buyers to walk around the entire sale. So, in another area of the sale, group baby clothes, bottles and toys together.
- 4. Get them to buy.**
Put price stickers on everything. Buyers don't want to guess or ask you what you want. Nor do they want to consult an elaborate chart with color-coded pricing on it to try to figure out how much you want for a particular item.

Here are some guidelines to make swapping worthwhile for all members.


Items must be clean and in working order.
