Minutes

Discussion

Much of the discussion focused on the increase in carrying charges.

The open session ended at 7:20 p.m. The board met in closed session and the meeting was adjourned at 9:05 p.m.



Looking back: Loan history

Independence Square Townhouses has a balloon payment of \$2.46 million due in September of 2024.

The cooperative spent three years investigating financing options and construction companies before signing the loan in October of 2009.

Independence Square was built in 1968 and consists of 22 buildings and 188 units.

Members were surveyed in 2006 about the work to be completed with refinancing. Medicine cabinets, vanities, storm doors and kitchen and bathroom floor coverings ranked high.

To pay for badly needed repairs and upgrades, the cooperative took out a loan of \$3.4 million.

The comfort and safety of members required that mansard shingles on all roofs be replaced that central air conditioning be installed in all units that front doors be replaced and that kitchens and bathrooms be upgraded.

The plan to accomplish the necessary work through refinancing began with an interview by the board of an architect in November of 2006.

Meetings with members were held to discuss the plans.

Over the next three years, 12 lenders were contacted before the board signed a 15-year loan of \$3.4 million at a fixed rate of 5.99 percent from National Cooperative Bank.

The project management firm was EVS, based in St. Louis; the construction firm was Still Contractors, based in Olathe; and the managing agent was Linville Management of North Kansas City.
