Mike called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

Minutes

The board approved minutes of the April 16 board meeting.

OPEN SESSION

Members signed in for the open session at 6 p.m.

Welcome

Mike welcomed them and announced the next board meeting to be Tuesday, June 18.

Site manager report

Jozie reviewed the site manager's report for May.

Three applications are pending and two have been denied.

Memberships are for sale on a one-bedroom, a two-bedroom and a four-bedroom.

Maintenance update

Jozie presented the maintenance report.

Three refrigerators and two water heaters have been replaced.

Two roofs were patched.

In April, 209 work orders were opened, 88 closed and 166 not yet completed. From annual inspections, about 20 are foundation issues and seven are pest controls. More than 40 work orders were issued based on yard inspections.

Managing agent's report

Tamara reported that the board will be working on the budget for the 2024-2025 fiscal year.

How to deal with ants, plastic wrap

Phyllis Cannon shared this recipe for getting rid of ants.

3/4 cup warm water

1 tablespoon of Borax

1/3 cup sugar

Dissolve Borax and sugar in warm water. Soak cotton balls in mixture. Place on waxed paper.

"I put the cotton balls on the sink and at the patio door," Phyllis said.

And another tip from Phyllis.

"If you struggle with plastic wrap, keep it in the refrigerator," Phyllis said.

Keeping the roll refrigerated takes the static out and the wrap does not stick to itself.

When pulling wrap off the roll, it will still stick to the dish you are covering.

Smoke Alarms


Alarms will be tested to make sure they are working. Those that aren't working will be replaced.

If the alarm has been deactivated or removed, the member will be charged for a replacement.

making sure trash is disposed of, cleaning up after any animals in the units and looking for other health and safety issues.

Please use water wisely

Water is provided for normal use.

Summer water usage is limited to filling a watering pool not more than 12 inches deep and to watering grass, shrubs and flowers.

Plastic wading pools no larger than five feet in diameter and no more than 12 inches in depth are allowed. They must be set up only in a fenced backyard and must be emptied daily and stored.

Running a sprinkler for children to play in is not allowed.

If a member allows water to run into the street, the member will be charged for excessive usage.

Washing motor vehicles on cooperative property is prohibited.



Fireworks prohibited

Please remember that fireworks are not allowed at Independence Square Townhouses.

Possession and storage or usage on

cooperative property place a member in default of the Occupancy Agreement.

Violation of the policy by members or their guests can result in the member's account being sent to the cooperative attorney for Termination of Right to Occupy; in other words, loss of membership.

Marilyn Porter appointed to board of directors

Marilyn Porter has been appointed to fill the vacancy on the board due to Sheryl Frank's death.

In years past, the custom has been to offer a vacancy created by an unexpired term to a candidate who ran for the board in the last annual election but was not elected. Marilyn ran for reelection to the board in 2023 but was not elected.

In keeping with the bylaws, the board agreed to appoint Marilyn to serve.

Marilyn served previously for 13 years and of those, nine years as board president.

At the September 2024 annual meeting, the positions held by Phyllis Cannon and Marilyn Porter will be up for election.
