Home fires are a greater risk in the winter when people cook holiday meals, display decorations and use heat sources unsafely, according to the U.S. Fire Administration.

Cooking is the leading cause of all winter home fires and 5 to 8 p.m. is the most common time for winter home fires, according to the National Fire Incident Reporting System.

Heating is the second leading cause of home fires.

The biggest mistake is putting something too close to a heating source. People, pets and anything else that can burn should be three feet away from space heaters, fireplace, wood stoves and radiators.

Plug portable electric heaters directly into the wall outlet. Don't use an extension cord or power strip.

In an effort to prevent injuries, fatalities and property damage, the U.S. Fire Administration urges

parents to educate their children about the nature of fire: fire can be fast, hot, dark and deadly.

Here are some tips.

Keep matches and lighters in a secured drawer or cabinet.

Encourage your children to tell you when they find matches and lighters.

Develop a home fire escape plan. Practice it with your children and designate a meeting place outside.

Supervise young children closely.

Teach children that fire is a tool, not a toy.

Show children how to stop, drop to the ground and roll if their clothes catch fire.

Show children how to crawl low on the floor. below the smoke, to get out of the house and stay out in the case of fire.

Teach children not to hide from firefighters.

Members are reminded that bags of ice melt are available free from the office for use on townhouse sidewalks, steps, stoops and other surfaces.

Only small bulbs outside. Fused, UL-approved holiday lights may be installed.

Holiday lights may be attached on the lower eave with clips approved by the Maintenance Department. Do not attach to shingles or other areas.

Outside lights must have no more than three 100-bulb strings attached together; and where plugged together, they must be taped with electrical tape to keep moisture out.

Holiday lights and yard decorations can be installed 30 days before a holiday and must be removed within two weeks after the holiday except for the time period from October 1 through January 15.

All decorations installed cannot cause any type of a trip hazard.
